Included with this month's newsletter is our yearly evaluation. Please take the time to fill it out and return it to us by the end of March. It helps a great deal to know where you feel we are doing a good job and where improvement is needed. Last year some of the suggestions of how we could improve the program were "Would like a consistent process to communicate nap/eating routines.", "More opportunities to volunteer would be nice.", "Love the science activities and would like to see more.", and "More fresh fruit and veggies added to the snack menu would be great."

To address the above suggestions, we have been using ProCare for tuition, and to communicate nap/eating routines. Due to the Covid restrictions being lifted we have been able to offer more opportunities for volunteering. We have added a STEM shelf in room six which can be rotated between classrooms to add more science activities to our program. We have also added fresh fruits and vegetables to our snack menu twice a week.
